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Session 5: Christ's Word on the Subject

An increasingly popular objection to the traditional Christian position on marriage claims that Jesus never said anything about ______.

"As for Jesus, he said nothing on the subject of homosexuality. You could argue, and many have, that he didn't have to make pronouncements. He was an observant Jew who would have regarded homosexuality as a sin. The truth is, we will never know his views on this subject. We do, however, have very clear statements from Jesus on how we are to behave towards one another: Judge not lest you be judged."
